

Dear Friends

Called to Serve

At this time of year, I often talk with couples preparing for marriage. "What difference will it make to be married?" I ask; and sadly, many reply. 'It won't make any difference at all'. They simply assume that their Wedding will be a celebration of what already exists. No wonder they pay so much attention to the Wedding Day (24 hours) and so little to the hopefully many years that will follow.

And, in a sense, we could ask the same question about the forthcoming Coronation. After all, the King became the king at the moment of his mother's death. That won't change when the crown is placed on his head.

But the Coronation is not just about the receiving of the crown, the opportunity for us all to celebrate and in doing so to add an estimated £1 billion to the UK economy. The Coronation is first and foremost a public declaration of commitment and service made before God and the people.

Words like commitment and service feel rather out of place in post-Covid Britain where so many of us have re-evaluated our priorities around ourselves and reduced our commitment to things outside. King Charles clearly hopes that as we witness his words of commitment, we may be challenged to review our own commitment to one another, to our communities – and perhaps to God too?

For followers of Jesus, our sense of commitment is rooted in His willingness to be a servant King. He 'did not come to be served, but to serve and to give up his life as a ransom for many'. (Mark 10:45)

In one of the prayers written to celebrate the Coronation, we pray that "we, with Charles our King, may give ourselves to the service of God and others, that our communities may flourish and be places of trust and friendship.

May we all be ready to say "Amen" to that. With my love and prayers

A Tribute to Michael Turner

It is with deep sadness that we announce the death of Michael John Turner of Saxonhurst, Downton. He died peacefully in Salisbury Hospital on Monday 20th March. Michael, or 'Gramps' to his seven grandchildren, provided guidance and leadership as the head of our family. He has left a lasting legacy not only to our family but to many others.

A broker for the Stock Exchange for over forty years, Michael moved with his family to the new development of Saxonhurst in 1981, to direct his family's business, H.V Vintners. He managed the group of off-licences and a post-office-greengrocery shop in the New Forest area, before returning as an Investment Trust specialist to the Stock Exchange in 1985.

Michael and his late wife Pauline became great and lasting friends with both the developer of Saxonhurst and their neighbours, and were soon involved in village life. Michael became a prominent figure in The Downton Horticultural society, organising flower shows, workshops, plant sales, trips, and newsletters over three decades. He joined the Fordingbridge Rotary Society, becoming president in 2006, raising funds for good causes and assisting in coordinating the annual fireworks display, attended by two thousand local families.

Always accommodating, generous and welcoming hosts, Michael and Pauline delighted friends and family from around the world with their sensational garden. Together, they travelled widely - they were best of friends. Michael continued to devote himself to his family after Pauline's death, his determination and integrity influencing all.

Spirited, generous and witty, Michael was a credit to his family; he will be deeply missed and lovingly remembered.

Some excerpts from the Council Chair's annual report:

This year has been very much influenced by changes to the Parish Council's staff. At the end of June 2022, we sadly received the resignations of both our long-standing Clerk Mrs Bev Cornish and our Administrative Officer Mrs Alison McGowan. However, we were delighted to have Ms Mel Camilleri join us from December 2022 as our permanent Clerk. We have had three Admin Officers, with two having to leave after short periods for personal reasons but we are now pleased to welcome Naomi Defriend as our Admin Officer.

In September 2022 we were all affected by the death of our late Queen. The Parish Council performed the required civic duties to both recognise the loss and to greet the new King. A recent planting of a tree in memory of the late Queen will hopefully be a lasting commemoration of the Queen's reign.

The Council recognises the benefits of working with members of the community.

- A group of residents, ably chaired by Mr Lawrence Burr, has
 reviewed and re-written parts of the Downton Neighbourhood Plan
 which was agreed as ready for submission by the Parish Council,
 and we are now awaiting comments from the Wiltshire Council
 Neighbourhood Plan team.
- The Council has also worked with the Downton Society to achieve 'heritage signs'. A member of the Society also maintains the planters on the Borough greens while the planters in Moot Lane have benefited from maintenance by residents of Moot Lane and Avon Dyke.
- We also continue to work with the primary school to understand the impacts of parking and an increased number of children now using the school.

The Council has maintained good working relationships with the police and it is during this year that a public space protection order has come into force in this area to give police greater powers over the misuse of catapults.

Progress on the Playground refurbishment project has been achieved with a reviewed application for a public works loan and the project plan and outline specification now ready for advertising for playground equipment providers to undertake the project.

We are also pleased to be part of the Wiltshire Towns Programme, an initiative led by Wiltshire Council to help promote the retail environment of local large villages and towns.

Recent poor performance by our contractor for bin collection and grass cutting has proved a sore point for both residents and the Council as commissioner. This is now being closely managed and, with the deterrent of not paying for the work, we are confident that this will be improved. The council has made several grants to local causes and maintained its routine and ongoing responsibilities.

The Council understands the impact of the current cost of living problems and worked hard to limit the increase in the Parish element of the precept for the current year to just below inflation levels. Due to increases in contract prices, utility costs and other responsibilities, it was felt that an increase was unfortunately unavoidable.

The Chair thanked all colleague councillors and several members of the community, and looks forward to a new year.

Kerbside recycling

There has been a lot of talk recently about recycling, with more items being collected by Wiltshire Council. Look on their website to check in detail what can, and can't, be collected in the black box and blue-top bin. www.wiltshire.gov.uk/recycling

What you can put in your blue-lidded bin

Plastic bottles, pots, tubs and trays (but no black plastics)

Tins, cans, empty aerosols and clean foil

Cartons, Paper and cardboard of any colour. Wash and squash bottles, and keep the lids on.

Keep items loose; don't put them inside each other, and never put them in a carrier bag inside your recycling bin. Make sure items are clean.

What you must not put in your blue-lidded bin

Black plastic - plastics are sorted using laser technology that can identify different plastic types. Black plastics are difficult for the equipment to detect so these cannot be separated for recycling from other materials managed at the facility, so are rejected.

Cardboard contaminated with foodstuff e.g. takeaway pizza boxes Film lids from pots, tubs and trays, Cling film, Crisp/sweet packets Plastic bags, eg, carrier bags, sandwich bags, freezer bags, bin liners Pet food pouches, Disposable drinks cups and plastic straws Compostable plastics (including cups, trays, films, and cartons) Plastic packaging and polystyrene

Plant pots (including black) - these can be taken to most household recycling centres or returned to garden centres for reuse

Rigid plastic eg toys, garden furniture

Boxes with plastic windows, please remove the window first

Foil-lined cardboard tubes (eg Pringles tubes)

Dirty cans or tins - please rinse all recyclables first, Clinical / medical products

Batteries, Scrap metal, Books, Textiles, Shredded paper, Coffee pods Plastic tubes (including toothpaste, hand cream tubes)

What you can put in your black box:

Clean glass bottles and jars (leave the lids on)

What you must not put in your black box:

Flat glass, Pyrex or any oven proof cookware, Lightbulbs.

Stunning and rare large perennials, including contemporary favourites such as Geums, Sanguisorba, Rodgersia, Baptisia, irises and lilies, as well as unusual species of Aquilegia, Ranunculus, and Thalictrum will be available. Grass species will also be for sale, alongside unusual hydrangeas and roses. All the plants have been grown in the UK especially for Horatio's Garden Chelsea.

Everything will be available to purchase on a first-come first-served basis. All profits will support Horatio's Garden, helping the charity to continue nurturing the wellbeing of people after spinal injury. Light refreshments, artisan crafts handmade by the charity's volunteers, and a full collection of the charity's bespoke merchandise will also be on sale.

Although the formal gardens will not be open, visitors will have the unique opportunity to enjoy the stunning grounds of the Longford Estate, the private ancestral seat of the Radnor family for over 300 years.

Horatio's Garden South West was created by six-time RHS Chelsea Gold Medal winning landscape designer Cleve West at Salisbury District Hospital in 2012. Since then, Horatio's Garden have opened a further six gardens across the UK.

Not a Ghost but a Gift

We used to call it Whitsun - White Sunday because long ago children marched to church in white on that day. No processions nowadays, and we've even changed its name. It's now 'Pentecost', which is more accurate but needs explaining.

This year Whitsun/Pentecost is on Sunday May 28th. Pentecost marks a vital event in Christian history. It is a celebrated 50 days after Easter. On the year Jesus was crucified (which took place at the Passover), the remnant of His followers, just 120 of them, were together in an upper room in Jerusalem. They were afraid to show their faces in case the authorities arrested them. But on the day of Passover they had an amazing collective experience.

They described it in terms of wind and fire, a great surge of spiritual energy and confidence. Afraid no longer they burst out on to the streets where crowds were gathering for the festival, led by Peter they began to tell them about Jesus and His resurrection. As they did so, although many of the people in the crowd were foreigners who spoke other languages, everyone heard them in their own tongue. Peter told them that what they were seeing was the fulfilment of an old prophecy when God would pour out His Spirit on the human race, men and women, young and old.

As a result of His words and the extraordinary spectacle, 3000 people believed and were baptized in the name of Jesus. They were the nucleus of what in 100 years would be a Church that would turn history upside down. For Christians Pentecost is in effect the birthday of the Church.

I realise many people find the whole idea of the Holy Spirit mysterious and elusive. It wasn't helped by the earlier title 'Holy Ghost'. The spirit is not spiritually a 'ghost' but a precious gift.

Redlynch and District History Society April meeting The New Forest Verderer's Court by Peter Frost

Peter, as a leading conservationist, artist and former Verderer, gave a great insight into the workings of the Court and its purposes in managing the open forest for the benefit of the Commoners, the landscape and the habitat in general.

The Verderers are a group of unpaid individuals whose primary objective is to regulate and protect the interests of the New Forest Commoners, and to "preserve the natural beauty and good traditional character of the Forest" under the 1877 New Forest Act; prior to that time, they represented the interest of the Crown.

They comprise 10 members, the Official Verderer, 5 elected verderers who own land or interests within the forest, and four representatives for DEFRA, Natural England, National Park and the Forestry Commission respectively. The verderers comprise the Verderers' Court, a body originally authorised by the crown to deal with those who offended against Forest Law.

In 1388, a building in which the New Forest courts could meet was constructed within or beside Lyndhurst's old manor house, the building which later became King's House. The current Verderers' Hall is believed to occupy the same site as the original, and the floor is believed to be original although most of the structure was renewed in the 18th-19thC.

The Verderers have a veto on activity on the open forest so no development can take place there without their agreement, thereby ensuring inappropriate misuse of the area is avoided. Peter reminded us that the woodland pasture and lowland heath is amongst the rarest and most important habitat in Europe. He showed a range of slides to illustrate key points and informed those present that anyone can attend the Court which takes place on the third Wednesday of most months in the Verderers Hall, which stands at the top of Lyndhurst High Street.

Our next meeting is "Put your best face forward", by actress and historian Jane Glennie, providing an interactive talk on helpful hints for the wartime housewife. Venue is Morgans Vale & Woodfalls Village Hall at 7.30 pm Tuesday 2nd May.


