Dear Friends

From the old I travel to the new



It was a bit of a shock to realise that this month it will be 50 years since I left primary school! I don't remember much about it, and I certainly don't recall any great celebrations for me and my classmates as we "went up" to secondary school. We may have got a mention in assembly, a "party" in the classroom and then it was home for tea - before heading out to church for choir practice as I did every Friday.

Plenty has changed over those 50 years and one of the positive changes is that we have learned much more about the importance of transitions, of ending and starting things well. Today's school children have a wonderful celebration of their progress, memories are shared, and tears are shed - if only by parents as they realise that their baby has now grown up!

Change, even if not traumatic, is always significant and needs to be prepared for, marked and celebrated well. Even the Church of England has caught up with the idea - I have been invited to attend a Pre-Retirement course - even if that transition is still some years off. (Maybe it's a subtle hint?!)

And perhaps it's no wonder that when we are going through great changes, either planned or not, many of us turn back to the big questions of life - such as God. Historically, the church has always been there to help mark these great transitions and, as one recent author has called it, to "Keep alive the rumour of God". Often in these times of change, people find a long-forgotten faith challenged and maybe revived.

In times of change, we need to know that we are "OK". We need to know that God is for us - on our side.

I am often reminded of Joshua, who having been Moses' right-hand man, was now called to step into his shoes and lead the people of Israel into the Promised Land. Whatever changes you are facing, God's words to Joshua can be His words to you as well: "Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)

A Summer Bible Study Course

After Easter we decided (with mixed feelings) to end the weekly on-line Sunday Slots, which had been going for three years. We promised to look at other ways to offer on-line resources – both to those within the Team area and far beyond.

With the success and positive feedback from the Team Lent Course, we have decided to try offering a six Week Bible Study Course three times a year – Lent, Summer and Autumn.

The first series will be called "Confidence in a complicated world". We will be reading and exploring extracts from the First Letter of Peter and discovering that, as we try to follow Jesus in our local communities today, we face similar challenges to those Christians in 1st century Asia Minor (now Turkey).

The first of the video talks will be appearing on our YouTube channel – "The Church in Landford" on 24th June.

As with the Lent Course – you can sign up to be part of the course. If you send an email to davidbramrec@aol.com you will receive weekly discussion questions to help you think further about the subject. You can use the videos and questions on your own, or meet in pairs or larger groups.

We all need "Confidence in a complicated world", so we hope you find this course enjoyable and challenging.



What's been happening?

This month the parish meeting takes place after the deadline for the magazine but there are some interesting things to report!

- The Parish Council agreed to fund plants for the planters in Moot Lane and three wonderful volunteers have planted them and agreed to look after them, watering as necessary. A bit of brightness goes a long way!
- The Parish Council also agreed that sowing wildflower seeds on the corner of the Beacon area would be a more sustainable approach than replacing the stinging nettles with more grass which would require regular mowing. A willing young volunteer helped to sow the seeds after some of the nettles were cleared to create a 'compost heap' to rot down and feed the commemorative tree next Spring. The remaining nettles will provide more nectar for the bees.
- With the confirmation of a loan, the Parish Council has arranged to meet different providers to ask for quotes for the playground refurbishment and this is taking place on the 16th June – this project will now be progressed to improve the facilities for children and young people on the Memorial Ground, the Moot Recreation ground and at Charlton-all-Saints.
- Following a high number of complaints from residents and repeated discussions with the grass cutters and the bin emptying service providers, the Parish Council is taking strong action to manage the contract and we expect to see improvement over the next month.
- Plans and quotes are being obtained for improvements to the Cemetery and it is hoped that some early results will be seen over the next month, with more improvements in the near future.
- The Neighbourhood Plan Review team are working on finalising a revised Plan following constructive feedback from Wiltshire Council.
 The revised Plan is being pursued to enable Parish residents to continue to influence any proposed new housing in the area.

The theme of his talk was about things that went wrong on some of his assignments, which he related with great humour, entertaining us by building up a clear picture of what was going on.

She shared her journey from the age of 10, when her mother gave her some fine thread and asked her to make a decorative edge round a piece of material; finding when she was 20 there were other thicker and different threads with which to create beautiful, textured pieces. Her use of slides on a large screen gave us the opportunity to see the different types of spinning wheels that made it possible to produce fine threads to very bulky, bobbly threads. There were some lovely samples that we could look at.

Redlynch and District Local History Society

On 6th June we had an early evening walk through Langley Wood, courtesy of Natural England's Manager, Stuart Hales, and the Local Warden Dave Bennett. We started at the top of Coles Lane and continued down the public footpath to see the site of old cottages, accompanied with maps from the mid 1800's. There was much interest in this and you can see the map for yourselves at Know Your Place (https://www.kypwest.org.uk). Select Wiltshire, scroll to the area you wish to view, then using the tab at the top of the right hand box select the map you wish to see.

We also saw areas of coppice which are maintained by Langley Wood Volunteers, deer fenced enclosures and the Open Wood which attempts to replicate the ancient practice of using cattle grazing to create a more open woodland with large trees. The enclosures are used to protect the natural regeneration of trees and some relocation of saplings with individual protection is also undertaken on a limited scale to fill gaps; only Langley Wood sourced trees are used in this way.

The walk concluded at the pond on the circular walk where the tale of Old Howards Cottage was related; this story was published in a fairly recent Redlynch Review. To summarise: the cottage which was brick and thatch burnt down in 1952 causing the demise of bed ridden Laura Howard who lived there with her retired gamekeeper brother and their housekeeper Olive Pickford. The difficulty of reaching the cottage in the middle of the wood was secondary to the inability to raise help quickly, the cottage having been burning for at least 2.5 hours before the first help arrived. When one considers this in conjunction with lack of mains water and power, it is not surprising that so many isolated cottages have disappeared.

The circular walk is open to the public for walks and is well sign posted, the rest of the wood is a National Nature Reserve and is NOT open to the public.

Our season of talks resumes on 5th September with a set of short talks with the theme of Family.

Treasurer: We have been successful in our quest for a new treasurer to replace Kate Crouch, who has undertaken that office for around the past 10 years! Nick Brown has been co-opted on to the committee and will be standing for election at the October AGM.






