



# From Rev David Bacon, Bramshaw Rectory Team Vicar in the Forest and Avon Team Dear Friends



#### "But ... dead guys don't come back to life"

One day, many years ago now, Julian was sitting in my study with a cup of coffee, pouring out his frustration. He was fascinated by Jesus but he was bored by the church and had decided to give up faith for good.

But then, in a moment that I'll never forget, he stopped ranting and said, very slowly, "But ... dead guys don't come back to life." And in that moment, he hit on what is the golden nugget of the Christian faith – the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. This is where our faith *must* stand or fall.

Writing less than 30 years after Jesus' Crucifixion, St Paul realised that the whole of the Christian faith depends on the answer to this one single question – Did God raise Jesus from the dead? If the resurrection is true, then Jesus *is* the Son of God, to be worshipped and adored; but if Jesus didn't rise from the dead, then Christians are, says Paul, "most to be pitied". (1 Cor 15:19).

For, without the resurrection there is no Gospel. If the resurrection did not happen, Jesus was nothing more than (at best) a great moral teacher, a good person who came to a cruel end at the hands of the Roman authorities. Many people (if they think of Him at all) see Jesus as just that – and nothing more.

But if the Bible's accounts of the Resurrection are true, if Jesus Christ *really is* risen today, everything changes because the resurrection is the ultimate proof that Jesus of Nazareth was not just a good person; He *was* who He claimed to be – the Son of God!

As we read in the Book of Acts about the preaching of the early apostles, we find a single phrase being repeated. "But God raised Him (Jesus) from the dead".

"But" isn't a very big word but like "love," it changes everything. And down the ages, people who have come to share this faith have seen their lives changed. Believing in the resurrection is not just about a ticket to heaven when we die; Jesus promises us that eternal life can begin here and now and that living our lives with Him will mean "life in all its fullness" (John 10:10)

I wish I could tell you that Julian's struggles with faith came to an end on that day in my study, but they didn't. Life following the Risen Christ isn't easy – He never said it would be. But the truth that Jesus is alive today challenged and changed Julian's life that day, and it can change your life too.

The fact is "Dead guys don't come back to life". But Jesus did!

With my love and prayers for a very happy Easter.



The Parish Council meeting was held at the Downton Memorial Centre on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2022. Four members of the public were present.

Before starting the meeting, the Chair said that the Council's thoughts were with everyone caught up in the war between Russia and Ukraine and thanked the community for the time, goods and services given so generously in support of those in need.

#### **Unitary Cllr Richard Clewer:**

Cllr Clewer reported that:

- There had been an extraordinary effort across the County regarding support for Ukraine and the best way to support those in need was through the DEC Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal.
- The Council was awaiting information from HM Government on how the scheme to house refugees from the conflict in Ukraine would work. It would issue a press release once this was known.
- The striking of waste collection staff due to a pay dispute with Hills Group was ongoing.

**Annual Parish Meeting:** The Council decided to invite the Police and Crime Commissioner and the Chief Constable of Wiltshire Police to attend the Annual Parish Council meeting at 7.00 pm on Monday 11th April 2022 at a venue to be agreed.

**Neighbourhood Plan Review Working Group:** Cllr Brentor gave a brief report on a recent meeting at which the:

- Timing of the traffic survey to be carried out in May or June had been agreed.
- Date for the meeting to form the Strategy Group to revise the Neighbourhood Plan was set at Tuesday 5th April 2022 at 6 pm.

**Vacancies:** There are currently 7 vacancies for councillors on the Parish Council. If you are interested in finding out more about becoming a councillor, please contact the Clerk.

#### Celebration Organ Recital - Friday 6th May at 7.00 pm

In 2017 St Laurence Church started the restoration of its pipe organ, which is a fine example of the work of the Victorian organ builder Willian Sweetland. Progress has been much delayed by the deaths of both of the original contractors and by Covid. It is now almost complete.

To celebrate this completion and to allow us to hear the organ at its best after many years the Assistant Director of Music from Salisbury Cathedral, John Challenger, has agreed to come and give a concert of organ music on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> May at 7.00 pm. The concert will include pieces by Bach, Elgar, Lefebure-Wely and Wesley.

#### **Downton Memorial Centre Update**

The Memorial Centre is now fully up and running following the various lock down periods during the past two years. The main hall is getting very booked now with old favourites, such as Tai Chi and Good Companions, plus new regular bookings including the community café ('Fridays') on the last Friday morning of each month. The latter is proving very popular and although it is not a replacement for the much-missed Country Market it will go a long way to help. Children's parties continue to be popular at the weekends particularly in the colder, wetter months.

There are also several new regular bookings in the extension – Seated Yoga, Pilates and Golden Oldies (sing along session for everyone). We are pleased that the Health Visitor drop in clinic is returning this month for the first time in two years. The two meeting rooms, as well as for classes, are suitable for all types of business meetings whether public or private. Please see the diary on the website to find out 'what's on' and, if you are looking to book one of the rooms, when free slots are available.

**The Small Office** – in addition to the Centenary and Bonvalot rooms, there is also a small office, suitable for one or two people, which can be booked either for a couple of hours or on a longer term basis. This may suit someone who is 'working from home' but would like an alternative space.

**Children's Party-Ware** – the Centre has a 'no single use plastic policy' where possible and so for children's parties multi-coloured plates, bowls and mugs are available to use at no extra charge.

**Crockery, Glasses and Cutlery for hire** – in addition to the crockery kept in the kitchen, that all hirers can use, the Centre possesses good quality crockery, cutlery and glasses (including champagne flutes) that can be hired for special events regardless of where they are being held. For more details, please contact the booking secretary.

During the period of the pandemic the electrics and fire alarm system have been brought up to date so with Wi-Fi throughout, a lift to the meeting rooms and a great stage, the Memorial Centre is well suited for meeting the needs of the growing community of Downton.

#### Downton Cuckoo Fair - 30th April 10.00am - 4.00pm

We are looking forward to getting back to fulfilling the purpose of the Fair - to support our local community and organisations by facilitating their fundraising at the Fair. We estimate that since 1980 the Fair has helped raise in excess of £1 million by local organisations, creating a very important source of income for them. Any money raised over and above running costs is offered back into the local community, for example covering the costs of a Christmas tree which is gifted to the village, or goes towards running the Fair the following year.

We understand that there will be concerns about us holding the Cuckoo Fair in 2022. We'd like to reassure everyone that we have direct contact with Wiltshire Council's Event Safety Advisory Group and take account of Industry wide guidance on holding safe events. We have highly qualified and experienced health and safety people on the Cuckoo Fair team as well as people who are on the front line of managing the impacts of Covid. So we have been very well placed to make an informed and measured decision about the Fair based on the latest information.

The FAQs on the front page of our website highlight the things we have considered in making decisions about holding the Fair in 2022 https://cuckoofair.co.uk/

On the day of the Fair one of the highlights is the crowning of the Cuckoo Fair Princess, which takes place outside The Goat Inn at 10am, and signals the official opening of the Fair. This is followed by the procession which begins at The Bull Hotel and ends at The Maypole. There are hundreds of different stalls located on the greens as well as the Produce Market which can be found in the car park behind the Co-op, with lots of bands to listen to and a variety of entertainment to enjoy throughout the day..To ensure the safety of visitors the B3080 through the village is closed from 08.30am to 6.00pm.

The Fair relies on a team of volunteers to organise and manage it. #### **Redlynch & District Historical Society March Meeting**

Over 60 members and guests enjoyed a first rate talk - 'New Forest Commoning, Past, Present and Future' by Dr Gale Pettifer, an active Commoner. Her knowledge of the subject and the thoughtful illustrated presentation was well appreciated and brought out a lot of questions. The first part was devoted to the history of commoning from earliest days, through the Roman Period, and the impact that William the Conqueror had in imposing Forest Laws. It is mainly this process of leaving the Forest open for hunting that has left it for us to enjoy today.

The Commoners, unable to fence land for agriculture, had to make use of the area as woodland pasture, which included heath and mires, in order to survive. Together with their stock, mostly ponies, cattle, pigs and donkeys, they maintain the landscape through a natural process. This was nearly lost in the 19th century when a national enclosure movement which had changed most of the country was attempting to do the same for the Forests. In 1871 the government put forward a Bill to enclose appropriate land for timber enclosures and sell off the remainder. This was resisted by one of the world's oldest conservation bodies - the New Forest Association (now called Friends of the New Forest), in a nationwide and ultimately successful campaign resulting in the 1877 New Forest Act.

As late as 2011 the government attempted to sell off the New Forest but eventually a Minister admitted they had 'got it wrong'.

The various forest rights that Commoners hold were explained, showing that all the stock is owned and that the rights go with the land that the Commoners occupy. Ponies and Cattle pasturing are the most important with Pannage (pigs foraging in the autumn) and fuel rights (Estover) enduring to a limited extent.

Forest stock is semi-feral; they are rounded up in 'drifts' once a year to check their condition and for tail marking, but most of the year they are self-sufficient. They eat holly and gorse in winter, use the latter for shelter when needed and know how to self-medicate. Despite this Commoners check their stock regularly as they know the 'haunts' that their stock frequent. Commoners work together in much the same way as they have for hundreds of years, as was the norm in much of the country until the 18<sup>th</sup> century when enclosures changed everything.

#### Redlynch & District Historical Society continued

It is still the commoning system that provides for the social, cultural and economic basis today, but care is needed now and in the future so that it is not 'loved to death' by visitors and locals alike.

Our next talk is on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> April at 7.30 pm in Morgans Vale & Woodfalls Hall and is entitled 'Who nominated our General Election candidates in the 1920's?' by Jane Howells.






