

For the beauty.....

During the Commonwealth Games, I watched the 10,000m women's race and was transfixed by the sheer persistence of one runner throughout but especially during the last 200m. You could see she was giving everything she had and felt the intensity at which she was having to dig deep to find what she needed. The pain and commitment were tangible as she crossed the line first, less than a second ahead of her competitor.

The scenes that followed between the winner and her mother, (who herself had been a 10,000m gold medallist) I found both emotional and beautiful. The mum and daughter were so overwhelmed with emotion, their tears and joy pouring out uninhibited by the media around them.

What was it that I found so moving? Reflecting after, I realised it was the sharing of those emotions that was so moving, the mother was so aware of what that moment meant to her daughter. This visible outpouring of emotions was for me the 'the joy of human love' revealed in a wonderful moment to all the world. The mother had emotionally shared, not just this race but her daughter's journey; the disappointments, the pain, the commitment, the losing and the winning.

When I'm asked why I became a vicar, the short answer is simply I found 'the joy of God's love'. The relationship between God and us, can be likened to the relationship between a loving parent and their child. God has even invited us to call him 'Our Father'.

As my heavenly Father, I discovered whether winning or losing his love and embrace would be with me every step of my life. He would celebrate my wins and encourage me up when I fall.

The joy of human love is immense, the joy of God's love is even greater!

The Meeting of the Council was held at the Downton Memorial Centre on 8th August 2022. Seven members of the public were present.

Unitary Cllr Richard Clewer: Cllr Clewer gave a brief report as follows:

- He and the leader of Swindon Borough Council had raised a number of issues on police response and action with the Police and Crime Commissioner who would raise them with the Chief Constable
- With Wiltshire Police currently being in special measures, there
 were a number of issues the force was tackling including one of
 staffing and of low morale.

Departure of Clerk: The Chair read out a statement thanking the Clerk for her 17 years of service to the Council and the good work she has done over the years which has been of benefit to the community. The Council agreed to appoint a locum clerk for an interim period of 3 months prior to making a permanent appointment.

Amenities: The Council approved quotes for the purchase of replacement goalposts in the Memorial Gardens and a new octagonal picnic bench for the play area in Charlton All Saints.

BT Pole Objection: BT and Wiltshire Council have acknowledged the Council's objection.

Iron Bridge Repair: Wiltshire Highways advised that work to install the new section of railings will take place in late September under two-way temporary traffic signals.

Vacancies: There are currently 6 vacancies for councillors. If you are interested in finding out more about becoming a councillor, please contact the Locum Clerk at the email address below.

St Laurence Church will again participate in the annual "Ride and Stride" on Saturday 10 September in aid of the Wiltshire Historic Churches Trust. St Laurence Church will provide hospitality and toilet facilities for any walkers and riders visiting the church. We will be looking for volunteers to spend an hour or more in church between 1000 and 1700 on Saturday 10 September to provide a welcome to any "ride and striders".

Our Treasurer, Mark Merrill, will again walk between a number of churches around Salisbury and hopes that many will sponsor him to do so. He would be happy for others to join him or to make their own journeys between churches either on foot or by bicycle. 




